Purpose of the funding

This academic year we will be receiving £16,204 funding from the government to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities in schools. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. These funds can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.
