On mental health week I thought it would be a good idea to share a bit more about counselling and what I do at school to promote the wellbeing of the children.

Were you aware that one in six school aged children has a mental health problem and 70% of children with Autism have at least one mental health condition?

A counsellor will not give advice or tell the child what to do. My role is to provide a space in which the child can

explore their feelings, thoughts and I will listen carefully to make sense of their situations and help them facilitate change. Therapy is usually weekly.

Just some of the issues that may come up in counselling include, relationship difficulties, lack of self esteem, destructive behaviour, self harm, bereavement, loss, depression, health issues, Autism, ADHD, OCD, anxiety, adoption, fostering, neglect, bullying and learning difficulties.

I understand that some children find it difficult to express themselves for a variety of reasons and I have various forms of expression available such as play dough, art and drawing materials, animals, dolls, action figures, games, sand, books and puppets, there are also focused activities on certain issues that we may use.

It is important to note that all counsellors follow the Ethical Framework For Good Practice In Counselling and psychotherapy as outlined by the BACP (British Association for Counselling and Psychotherapy) It is also a requirement that all counsellors attend confidential supervision in order to maintain ethical and professional standards of practice thus ensuring the highest possible standard of care to the children.

I have been a qualified counsellor for over 15 years. About 5 years ago I also completed my play therapy diploma as I found myself using play so much more in my work.

I have a open door policy and try to be as transparent as I can, whilst keeping to my therapeutic boundaries, so if anyone would like to ask a question or for some advice please do email the school admin and they will pass on your requests.

Next Friday, 21st May, Reception and Nursery children get the chance to dress up in their chosen career uniform as part of their 'People That Help Us' topic.


