
#### RE

Religious leaders are the focus of our Religious Education lessons this half-term. We will be looking at the qualities that make a religious leader as well as exploring how faith helps people to understand life's big questions.

#### Science

Our Science investigations this half-term will be looking more closely at materials and the processes of dissolving and evaporating.

For our second topic, we will start to look at living things and their habitats. To start, we will look at the different parts of plants and how they change and grow.



#### Maths

In Maths we will be learning about: 2D and 3D shapes, reflection and translation and measuring and drawing angles.

## Topic

This half-term we will be doing a history topic. We will start our exploration of the past by discovering Anglo-Saxon artefacts and travelling back in time to see what school would have been like as a young Anglo-Saxon. Next we will start to look at the Viking invasion of England and the legacy these people left behind.
