- Domestic violence

- Adult health needs
- Mental health
- Substance misuse, drug and alcohol problems
- Self harm
- Issues within the home
- Inappropriate supervision
- Housing imminent risk of eviction
- Sort financial difficulties
- Regular involvement in criminal/anti-social behaviour

- CYPE entering justice system
- Unemployment
- Legal enforcements schools are not the place to hold meetings with violent/volatile parents
- Non engagement with intensive family support should be automatically escalated
- When multi school/education establishments involved
