Sports Premium Report 2014-15

The Sports Premium was introduced to promote school sports across the country. Featherstone Wood has received £8,500 in additional funding, which we are using on a wide range of activities, including:

- Stevenage Sporting Futures – An organisation to create a sustainable PE and Sports network that creates more opportunities for young people to aspire and achieve through PE and School Sport.
