

Context of school

- Featherstone Wood Primary School is an undersubscribed one form entry school situated in south Stevenage. The site was originally built as a two form entry school and so has ample space and large grounds. Over the past four years the reputation, quality of provision and Ofsted grade has improved and the number of children have increased. (183 in January 2014 to 205 March 2017)
- The current Headteacher was seconded as acting deputy and SENCo in September 2013 and became substantive Headteacher in January 2014. A returning member of staff became SENCo in January 2014, the new deputy started in April 2014. Excellent succession has now seen the SLT evolve into the Headteacher and three assistant heads responsible for curriculum, SEN and pastoral.
- Due to the considerable vulnerable nature of the majority of our families the leadership identified the need of significant pastoral and nurture support for pupils and families. Developing pupil resilience and emotional maturity is key to enabling positive learning and is at the heart of the day to day provision Featherstone Wood offers
- 20% of our pupils are on our inclusion register.
- 36% of our pupils claim Free School Meals.
- 21% of our PPG Pupils are SEN.
- The school has a low stability rate with 77.8%.
- PPG are a highly mobile group. 27% of our school leavers 14/15, 46% of our school leavers 16/17, 45% of our school leavers September to March 16/17.
- 39%14/15, 40% 15/16 and 48% 16/17 of our arrivals are PPG.
- 13.7% of our pupils have English not as their first language(EAL)
- 30.7% of our children are from Ethnic Minority groups.
- Focused effort has ensured that the attendance rate has risen over the last three years. September 2014-March 2015 was 88.14%, September 2015- March 2016 was 92.12%, currently as of March 2017 it is 94.37%.
- We have three pupils who are CLA, they started at the school in September 2016 and they were taken into care in the October.
- We have a large number of vulnerable families 36, who have either had social care involvement and no longer meet the threshold or have never met thresholds but require support.
- Currently we have 1 CP family, 2 CIN families, 6 families with Intensive Family Support Team engagement, 7 families on e-CAF.
- Attainment on entry is below national expectations and below Hertfordshire schools. Many enter with low linguistic or communication skills, and poor PSED and motor skills.
- 26% on entry to nursery are identified as 'at risk of SEN'

Recent and New Initiatives

- This year, specialist intervention has continued. Adults were precisely deployed and trained to meet needs of all learners enabling all children to make progress.
- Whole school phonics training, with the introduction of Story Time Phonics to accelerate the progress of all children
- As part of our 'early intervention' for children with identified requirements in EFYS, children are identified and given specialist support to enable them to make rapid gains in language acquisition.
- The Leadership of the school has recognised that a major barrier of children's learning is their chaotic and turbulent home lives. Each year group will develop mindfulness within their classroom. Further support is available for our most vulnerable groups through the nurture groups which help develop the self-esteem and emotional awareness of individuals.
- To support the learning of our vulnerable groups, pupil premium families will be provided with a subsidy towards the costs of enrichment activities or other day to day school education costs.

Objectives of Pupil Premium Spending

Our key objective in using the Pupil Premium Funding is to ensure that all pupils make good progress. Historical



attainment for groups across the school has been low but as levels of attainment rise, we are working to ensure that there is no gap between pupil groups. Common barriers for children in receipt of FSM can be weak language and communication skills, a lack of confidence, less support at home, more frequent behaviour difficulties and attendance and punctuality issues. There may also be complex family situations which prevent children from flourishing.

Through targeted intervention we are working to eliminate barriers to learning and progression. Many children start our school with a very low baseline of attainment and below average language skills and our aim is to ensure they make accelerated progress in order to reach at least age related expectations as they move through the school.

We have analysed our data thoroughly and have made use of research such as 'Ofsted, The Pupil Premium, How schools are spending the funding successfully to maximise achievement' (2012) and The Sutton Trust Teaching and Learning Toolkit in order to help us make more informed choices about the effectiveness and impact of interventions on learning and attainment.

In addition to this we have identified some key principles (outlined overleaf) which we believe will maximise the impact of our pupil premium spending:

Key Principles

Building Belief

We will endeavour to provide a culture where:

- Staff believe in ALL children
- There are no excuses made for underperformance
- Staff adopt a solution focused approach to overcoming barriers

Analysing data

We will ensure that:

- Data is analysed on a regular basis so that performance can be monitored and problems addressed early
- Staff are involved in the analysis of data so that they are fully aware of the strengths and weaknesses across
 the school.

Identification of Pupils

We will ensure that:

- All teaching and support staff are involved in the identification of pupils
- All staff are aware of who the pupil premium and vulnerable learners are in their class
- All pupil premium children benefit from the funding, not just those who are under performing
- Underachievement is targeted at all levels (not just lower attaining pupils)
- Children's individual needs are considered carefully so that we provide support for those children who could be doing "even better if..."

Improving Quality First Teaching

We will continue our endeavour to ensure that all children across the school receive good teaching, with increasing percentages of outstanding teaching by using our Senior Leaders to:

- Set high expectations
- Address any variance within school
- Ensure consistent implementation of the non-negotiables such as planning, marking and guided reading
- Share good practice within the school and draw on external experience
- Provide access to high quality CPD
- Improve assessment through joint levelling and moderation

Increasing Learning Time

We will maximise the time spent on closing the gap through:

- Improving attendance and punctuality
- Providing earlier intervention at KS1 and EYFS
- Extended learning out of school hours through early morning support and after school booster sessions

We will ensure that the additional support we provide is effective by:



- Looking at the individual needs of each child and identifying their barriers to learning
- Ensuring support staff and class teachers are given the opportunity to communicate regularly
- Matching the skills of the support staff to the interventions they provide
- Providing support for parents so that they are able to support their child's learning within the curriculum and manage in times of crisis
- · Tailoring interventions to the needs of the child
- · Recognising and building on children's strengths to further boost confidence

In our determination to ensure that all children succeed, we recognise the importance of and are committed to providing individualised interventions for set periods of time to support children in times of crisis.

Funding priorities 2016/17

- This year, our priority is to continue to raise standards in our Early Years provision. Developing the learning environment and skills of the teaching staff. Individuals will be identified and given specialist interventions.
- In literacy the school is developing the teaching phonics through the use of Story Time phonics and whole school training.
- Across the school will continue to develop the ICT. Children will be provided with ipads in their classroom. In addition, ICT will be developed across the school to enhance the learning of other curriculum area.
- The school has recognised that a major barrier to many of the children's learning is their chaotic and turbulent home lives. M1ndfulness will be part of the curriculum with each learning space developing a mindfulness space.
- Specialist interventions, to accelerate progress of our children, will be developed through staff training, rigorous assessment and identification of individuals and quality first hand teaching.
